The exact amounts of fuel used to generate electricity depends on the efficiency or heat rate of the generator (or power plant) and the heat content of the fuel.

Solar energy generates only 0.8 kg of CO₂ per kilowatt-hour, making it an eco-friendly alternative to conventional energy sources. Solar energy operates without burning fossil fuels, ...

For example, from cradle to grave, coal-fired electricity releases about 20 times more GHGs per kilowatt-hour than solar, wind, or nuclear electricity (based on median estimates for each technology).

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
