

How to remove the snap nuts of photovoltaic brackets

Insert the two screws through the outer heat sink fins on both sides of the inverter and into the bracket. Use a PH 2 Philips screwdriver and a torque wrench to tighten the screws to a torque of 4 N*m / 35.4 ...
