In 1908, the Soci#233;t#233; Ottomane du Gaz de Beyrouth distributed electricity in the city of Beirut, replaced by the Soci#233;t#233; d'lectricit#233; de Beyrouth in 1923, a company incorporated under French law. Before 1939, the company operated a 4,500 kW diesel power plant and a 6,400 kW hydraulic plant. In March 1954, the Lebanese State bought the Beirut Electricity Company, which became the Electricity Office. The Zouk power station went into production in 1956.
