

The Gambia's Long-Term Climate-Neutral Development Strategy 2050 (LTS) aims to achieve net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2050 through sustainable development practices, focusing on mitigation, ...

The Gambia's target aimed to unconditionally reduce emissions by 2.7% by 2030, below business-as-usual (BAU) and, conditional on international financial support, aimed for a target of 45.4% reduction by 2030.

Gambia's latest greenhouse gas output is modest in global terms, contributing only a very small share of worldwide emissions. On a per person basis, emissions are rated low-within the green zone-though ...

Considering The Gambia's high dependence on fossil fuel imports for its energy supply, mitigation measures such as increasing renewable energy generation hold the potential to enhance energy security and reduce ...

Twenty circular GHG mitigation opportunities are proposed within the sectors addressed. Taken together, they can reduce national GHG emissions by 36 percent, reduce The Gambia's international carbon footprint by 38 ...

In July 2022, the Government of The Gambia expressed their interest in receiving support from the SCALA programme, which supports countries in building adaptive capacity and reducing greenhouse gas emissions ...

The Gambia's updated Nationally Determined Contribution (NDC) sets out an emissions reduction target of 49.7% (incl. LULUCF) below business as usual (BAU) by 2030 which translates to an absolute emissions ...

Has the Gambia's economic growth decoupled from its CO2 emissions? To reduce emissions and achieve increasing prosperity at the same time, we have to decouple economic growth from CO2 emissions.

This paper analyzes The Gambia's vulnerability to climate change, highlighting risks like flooding, droughts, and coastal erosion, which threaten food security and key industries.

The Gambia has an NDC target that would bend its emissions downwards; however, its current policies are not on track to meet this target. The Gambia will need to implement more stringent policies to meet its NDC ...
